Latest Town Hall Brings City Staff to City Residents

As part of its commitment to providing a transparent government and serving its residents and visitors, the City of Powder Springs hosted its third quarterly town hall of 2024 on Aug. 29 at the Ford Center.

Following a welcome from the Mayor and City Council, attendees had the chance to meet city department heads and supporting staff members to learn more about their specific operations and latest initiatives, and to ask questions.

Those who attended the town hall

“virtually” by watching it on Facebook Live heard directly from city department leaders as they were interviewed by communications support staff. In between these interviews, viewers could catch important info shown via a PowerPoint presentation.

In-person attendees had a chance to ask the mayor and council questions at the end of the meeting, with the livestream capturing the dialogue.

- Thursday's route (Nov. 28) will be picked up on Monday, Dec. 2. Friday's route (Nov. 29) will be picked up on Tuesday, Dec. 3, along with Tuesday's normal route. Any trash not picked up on Monday and Tuesday will be picked up through the remainder of the week.

Christmas Holidays, Dec. 24-25, 2024

- No yard waste will be collected Dec. 30.
- Tuesday's route (Dec. 24) will be picked up on Thursday (Dec. 26) along with Thursday's normal route; any trash not picked on Thursday will be picked on Friday. Wednesday's route (Dec. 25) will be picked up on Friday (Dec. 27); Friday's normal route will be picked up on Monday, Dec. 30.

New Year's Day, Jan. 1, 2025

- No yard waste will be picked up on Jan. 6.
- Wednesday's route (Jan. 1) will be picked up on Thursday (Jan. 2), along with Thursday's normal route. Any trash not picked up on Thursday will be picked up on Friday. Friday's route (Jan. 3) will be picked up on Monday (Jan. 6).

City Hall Construction Continues Toward Early 2025 Opening

City residents, business owners, and future arrivals to our city will be served starting next year by a new City Hall at the former site of our Municipal Court.

The two-story facility on Jackson Way Extension between Oak View Drive Extension and Pineview Drive and across the street from Thurman Springs Park, is set to open in early 2025, allowing our Municipal Court and city departments to return to downtown.

Among the latest work on the facility was the pouring of the second floor on Sept. 9.

Other key milestones on the project will be shared on the city's social media channels, and you can expect an update on the project in January in our first quarterly newsletter of 2025 — our 2024 Year End Newsletter.



Second-Ever Class of City's Youth Council Gears Up for a First-Class Year

Election Day for Federal, State, County Offices Nov. 5

In-person advance voting for federal, state and county offices in Cobb begins Tuesday, Oct. 15, at 12 locations across Cobb County, with the closest for city residents being the Ron Anderson Recreation Center, 3820 Macedonia Road in Powder Springs. Advance voting will continue weekdays and Saturdays through Nov. 1, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., with a handful of county locations (including the Boots Ward Recreation Center at 4845 Dallas Highway) also offering Sunday voting on Oct. 20 and 27 from noon to 5 p.m.

There is no voting Nov. 2-4, with Nov. 5 the final day to vote at voters' assigned polling places. Drop boxes for absentee ballots will be located in six advance voting locations (Boots Ward among them) and open only during voting hours; they may also be hand-delivered to the county's Main Elections Office during office hours until 7 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 5.

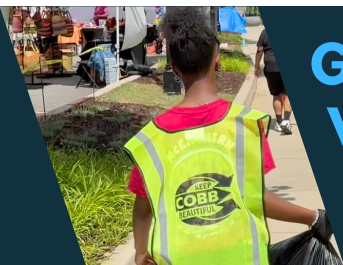

The deadline to register to vote or to change one's address prior to the November general election is Oct. 7. Visit <https://mvp.sos.ga.gov/> to register, view registration information on file, find poll locations and more.

Following a judgment by the Cobb Superior Court, Powder Springs residents and others living in Cobb Commission District 4 will not see the office on their ballots, as the results of the May primary were vacated and the general election contest for it canceled. A new primary and general election to determine the District 4 commissioner through 2028 will be held in the first half of 2025, with qualifying, election and possible runoff dates dependent on whether a runoff is required in December following the Nov. 5 general election. More details will be announced on cobbcounty.org/elections.
